On Thursday the 22nd of August, Year 11 students gathered in the school Lunch Box to collect their exam results. We are immensely proud of the hard work, dedication and achievements throughout their academic journey with us here at St Philip Howard.

For the Class of 2025, results were excellent with the year group achieving a positive progress score (meaning most students achieved or exceeded their targets) and this was for the second year in a row.

20% of all grades awarded were the top grades (7-9) and

55% of all grades awarded were a strong pass.

# No Pen Day


