#### School Attendance update 2025

At SPH, we place a high priority on regular attendance because it directly impacts student learning, wellbeing, and future opportunities. Being in school every day helps students build routines, stay connected, and succeed academically and socially.

According to national guidance, a student is considered a **persistent absentee** if their attendance falls below **90**%—that's the equivalent of missing a **day every two weeks**. Over the course of a school year, this adds up to nearly **four full weeks of lost learning**.

What do attendance figures actually mean?

95%	=	47 LESSONS MISSED EACH YEAR 8 days in total or 1 week and 3 days
90%		95 LESSONS MISSED EACH YEAR 16 days in total or 3 weeks and 1 day
85%		142 LESSONS MISSED EACH YEAR 24 days in total or 4 weeks and 4 days
80%	-	190 LESSONS MISSED EACH YEAR 32 days in total or 6 weeks and 2 days

Based on 190 school days and 5-6 lessons a day.

We follow the **DfE's "Working Together to Improve School Attendance"** framework, which encourages a whole-school approach involving families, school staff, and support services. We believe in early support and open communication with families to address barriers to attendance.

Staff at SPH will offer support to families to remove any barriers to attendance before considering any legal intervention, this can only be achieved with the full support and cooperation of parents. If support is not engaged with, options become limited and a request to the Local Authority to begin legal proceedings will commence.

#### **Penalty Notice Fines for School Attendance**

Education Penalty Notices are issued to the parents of statutory school age children and can be issued to each parent or carer who is deemed liable for the child's absence from school.

First Offence

The first time a penalty notice is issued for Term Time leave or irregular Attendance, the amount will be: £160 per parent, per child, paid within 28 days. This is reduced to £80 per parent, per child, if paid within 21 days.

• Second Offence (Within 3 Years)

The second time a penalty notice is issued for Term Time leave or irregular Attendance, the amount will be: £160 per parent, per child, paid within 28 days

• Third Offence (Within 3 Years)

The Third time an offence is committed for Term Time leave or irregular Attendance, a Penalty Notice will not be issued. The case will be presented straight to the Magistrates Court.

Magistrates' fines can be up to £2500 per parent or child with a high rise in prosecution.

#### **Term Time Holidays**

Students can only take a Leave of Absence during Term Time if there is an exceptional circumstance and advanced approval have been secured. Leave taken without Schools knowledge or authorisation may result in a penalty notice and/or prosecution.

At St Philip Howard Voluntary Academy, we are committed to helping every student succeed—and that starts with showing up! If there are barriers to attendance, we are here to help and support.
