Uniform

Our policy on school uniform is based on the notion that school uniform:

- is practical and smart;
- identifies the children with the school;
- prevents children from coming to school in fashion clothes that could be distracting in class;
- makes children feel equal to their peers in terms of appearance;
- is regarded as suitable wear for school and good value for money

Uniform: You must wear the following:

- School tie
- White plain shirt
- Plain, black trousers (jeans/cords/canvas/linen/skinny trousers are not acceptable)
- Black tailored shorts
- Plain black skirt, sensible length (pencil skirts, Lycra skirts and short skirts are not acceptable)

- School burgundy plain v-neck jumper with school logo (key stage 3 pupils)
- School black plain v-neck jumper with school logo (key stage 4 pupils)
- Plain black/white socks or black tights
- Black flat sensible shoes with no logo/motif (not boots, trainers, canvas or flip flops)

P.E. KIT - The Essentials

- Academy, black, approved Polo shirt with school crest.
- Academy PE shorts.
- Sports trainers
- Black socks.

P.E. Kit – Additional

- A plain black under armour/layer can be worn in the winter.
- Optional approved burgundy hoodie with school crest.

Hair and Make-Up

Pupils are expected to wear hair in a neat and acceptable style. Hair must be of one colour, natural in appearance. Hair styles must not be cut below a number two. Hair styles judged to be extreme by the Head Teacher are not permitted.

Make up, including coloured nail varnish, lip gloss and fake tan, is not to be worn. Hair fashion accessories are also not to be worn. False nails and other beauty accessories are not acceptable. If hair bands are worn.

Pupils who do not conform to the Academy's appearance policy will be sanctioned in line with our behaviour policy.

Jewellery

Watches and one small stud earring in each ear lobe are the only pieces of jewellery permitted at St Philip Howard Catholic Voluntary Academy. The Academy does not take any responsibility for the loss of or the damage to personal possessions brought on to site. Large amounts of money or items of jewellery will be confiscated by staff if rules are continually breached.

Pupils who do not conform to the Academy's policy on jewellery will be sanctioned in line with our behaviour policy.

The Head Teacher reserves the right to make the final decision on what is or what is not appropriate.

Mobile Phones

We advise that pupils do not bring mobile devices into the Academy. Mobile devices and headphones must not be visible. However, we do recognise that some parents may wish their child to have a mobile device with them as they travel to and from school. Any mobile devices brought in should both switched off and put away as soon as they enter the school premises. We do not take any responsibility for loss or damage to mobile devices. If a pupil's mobile device is seen whilst on the premises then it will be confiscated without notice. If confiscated then parents/carers will be expected to collect the mobile phone from the school office.
